

## Public Registers of External Examiners

### Purpose

1. This Direction seeks to promote consistency in the exercise of the functions of local regulatory authorities in relation to the designation of persons eligible to be appointed as External Examiners under the Legal Profession Uniform General Rules 2015 (Uniform Rules). External Examiners report to regulators on the trust records of law practices.
2. It also seeks to advance the objective stated in section 126(a) of the Legal Profession Uniform Law (Uniform Law) to ensure that appropriate safeguards in relation to business practice and professional conduct are in place, to maintain the integrity of legal services.
3. On 3 September 2018, rule 65A of the Uniform Rules will commence in New South Wales and Victoria.
4. Rule 65A provides the designated local regulatory authorities (DLRAs) with the power to revoke a person's designation as an External Examiner under the Uniform Law (usually an accountant or an auditor), as a safeguard to deal with instances where questions about their competence and/or suitability arise.
5. A 'show cause' process is included in rule 65A so that written notice must be provided to the person subject to the proposed disqualification, and that person will be invited to make submissions for the consideration of the DLRA.
6. The Legal Services Council resolved that Public Registers of eligible External Examiners, maintained by the DLRAs of the participating jurisdictions, and linked to the Legal Services Council website, will inform relevant stakeholders.

### Direction

Having regard to its opinion that the following direction is necessary and appropriate to ensure that the designated local regulatory authorities act in a manner that promotes inter-jurisdictional consistency in the application of the Legal Profession Uniform Law and of the Uniform Rules, the Legal Services Council

HEREBY GIVES A DIRECTION TO:

- The Council of the Law Society of NSW; and
- The Victorian Legal Services Board

to maintain a Public Register of eligible External Examiners, subject to applicable privacy law, linked to the Legal Services Council website, so that law practices, consumers of legal services, designated local regulatory authorities, other relevant regulatory bodies in Australia, the Council and the general public may be informed of persons who satisfy rule 65 and whose status as a designated person is not revoked under rule 65A of the Legal Profession Uniform General Rules 2015.

This direction does not require the Public Register to disclose information about a person whose consent to such disclosure has not been obtained.

Both are empowered to issue guidelines and directions under section 407 of the Legal Profession Uniform Law. This Direction is issued by the Legal Services Council to assist the DLRAs to enforce rule 65A of the Legal Profession General Uniform Rules 2015 and to maintain the integrity of legal services
